- A. What passages does the author use to show that Christ was appointed by God as priest?
- B. What were the characteristics of Christ's prayers during his life?
- C. Think through what it means that Christ learned obedience and was thereby perfected.
- D. Jesus Christ is the cause, the personal, mediating cause of eternal salvation. He is the concrete and active cause of it. (Vine)
