The Goal: To help you develop the knowledge and skills to build a biblical worldview that will sustain you as you face the routine decisions of life and are challenged by ideas and events that you have not confronted before. See 1 Chronicles 12:32

Categories of Study Covered by a Worldview

We are not going to look at all of these topics and questions, but the point is that a person's worldview will speak to each of these areas. We will touch on some of these as we go along.

Theology – Is there a God? What is He like? What does He require of us?

Philosophy – What is true and how do we know? What is knowledge and how do we know what we know? What is good and beautiful?

Ethics – What is right? What is wrong?

Biology - What is life and where did it come from?

Psychology - What is man like? Why do I do and feel the way I do? What's wrong with us?

Sociology - How should humans relate to one another and group together? What kinds of societies are best? What about church, marriage and family?

Law – What is the role of law in our lives? Where do laws come from? What laws do we have to obey?

Politics - What's the relationship of ourselves to government? Where do governments come from and why do they exist?

Economics - How does money work? How do work, productivity and money relate? What about saving and investing?

History - Where is history going? What does it show us? Is knowledge of history important?

A great resource is <u>Understanding the Times</u> by David Noebel (This is a thick textbook on the Christian worldview compared to humanism, Marxism, etc.)
