- 1. What does it mean and what are the implications of being created in the image of God (Gen 1:26-27)?
- 2. How did the fall impact that image? (See James 3:9)
- 3. In Genesis 1:28 we are told we are to subdue and have dominion. What does that mean? See also Psalm 8:6-8
- 4. What should be our attitude toward our environment? Is polluting acceptable in the Christian worldview?
- 5. God's provision of food (note the progress):

Genesis 1:29; 2:16 (Note God's generosity, not His limiting)

Genesis 9:3

Acts 10:15

1 Tim 4:3-4; Romans 14:14

Be careful not to call unclean what God has called clean and is sanctified by Him.

What are some biblical limitations on what or how we eat?

6. God's provision for work (Genesis 2:7-9,15)

Was there work before the fall?

We need to see that God created the world as a resource for man to manage and to use for his needs and creativity for the glory of God. See how everything works together in Psalm 104:10-23.

We are to be creative and skillful since God is. Our skill, creativity, and inventiveness demonstrate the glory of God. See the skills needed in the following passages and think about the skills that were necessary to prepare for these skills.
